If you answer “yes” to these questions, then we’d like to invite you to participate in an arts-based research project involving taking pictures (Photovoice) or making a symbol or a piece of art work (Anishnawbe Symbol-Based Reflection) that relates to living with diabetes.

You will receive a \$50 gift card for taking part, as well as a one-week TTC metropass. We can help with equipment and materials, as well as with child care if needed.

The orientation session lasting approximately 1.5 hours will be held the first week of October. A second session lasting approximately 1.5 hours will be held after you have completed your art work or photos.
